Enclosed you will find the HAZNY and a Hazard Analysis Matrix produced by the HAZNY for your individual municipality based on the questions you answered during the 4/14/11 Highway Superintendent's Meeting.

Also enclosed are two color charts.

The first is titled, "Hazards v. Ratings for Municipalities (HAZNY Calculated Rates)." This chart takes all the responses, calculates them with the HAZNY software program, and then averages the hazard rates. This is the chart and scores that will be used for the update to the Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan (Plan).

The second colored chart is titled, "Hazards by Average Municipal Ranking (not using the HAZNY Rates)." The chart takes <u>your</u> ranking of the hazards (1-23, with 1 being the hazard most likely to happen) and averages them. For instance, the hazard that had an average ranking of 1.7 (or the one most of you select as the number one hazard) is "Winter Storm".

I was pleased with the way things ended up. The two charts are very similar; which means you guys did a really good job! If you would like your municipality's individual HAZNY adjusted in any way, just let me know and I'd be happy to change it to suit you.

I am also enclosing a map of your municipality. Please mark on it individual locations where certain hazards may occur. For instance, if there are a few places where you are particularly concerned Ice Jams or Landslides are likely to happen; mark them on the map. The Plan concentrates mostly on *natural* hazards, though if you'd like to note places where transportation accidents, explosions, or other hazards not related to nature are likely to happen, please do and I will pass that information on to Emergency Services for consideration in their County-wide Emergency Services Plan.



Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan to be discussed

LITTLE VALLEY, NEW YORK (June 14, 2012) – Cattaraugus County will host a public information meeting on its Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan to obtain public comments, and to provide information on this comprehensive mitigation project. The meeting will be held on Wednesday, June 27 at 6:30 p.m. at the Little Valley County Center.

Cattaraugus County has received a grant to complete a mandatory five-year update of its existing Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan. This plan will identify key actions to be taken to reduce or eliminate the long-term risk to human life and property from natural disasters such as floods, severe storms, and ice storms. The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) defines hazard mitigation as a "sustained action taken to reduce or eliminate long-term risk to people and their property from hazards."

The Disaster Mitigation Act (DMA) of 2000 requires local governments to have a hazard mitigation plan approved by FEMA. This plan will eventually form the basis for a long-term strategy to help reduce or eliminate disaster losses, and break the cycle of disaster damage, reconstruction, and repeated damage.

To be in compliance with DMA 2000, a municipality must by recognized by FEMA for its participation in the County's hazard mitigation plan development process and formally adopt the final plan; or prepare their own hazard mitigation plan.

This planning process allows Cattaraugus County and its partners to identify ways to significantly reduce their vulnerability to natural hazards. "It creates a risk-based decision making process for reducing damages to lives, property and the local economy from future disasters," said Crystal Gross, Cattaraugus County's Mitigation Plan Coordinator.

Having a FEMA-approved mitigation plan also maintains the County's and its partners' eligibility for certain federal disaster assistance and hazard mitigation funding programs.

"The entire planning process is just as important as the plan itself," said Gross. "In order to apply for any mitigation funding, you must have FEMA approval."

All municipalities and organizations that participate in the County plan or have their own approved plan are eligible for FEMA pre-disaster funding. This funding can be used to identify and construct projects that reduce long-term risks to life and property from a natural disaster.

"Hazard mitigation plans are developed BEFORE a disaster strikes. That's why it is vitally important that all of our municipalities either participate in this process or prepare their own plans," said Gross. Once completed, the plan will identify community policies, actions, and resources for long-term implementation to reduce risk and potential future losses. The County and its partners will adopt, implement and maintain the plan on an ongoing basis, which will gradually lessen the impacts associated with natural disasters.

All County municipalities will be contacted to re-affirm their participation in the multijurisdictional process and to allow them to add any new areas of concern since the current plan was adopted in 2007.

Purpose of Plan:

Cattaraugus County is in the process of updating our Plan. The Mitigation Plan can be viewed at http://www.cattco.org/ems/downloads/ The mandatory update will allow the County and its participating municipalities to continue to be eligible for FEMA hazard mitigation funding.

Identify potential hazards: Ice Storms, Severe Storms, Floods, Winter Storms, etc. and how they could impact existing and future buildings, infrastructure and critical facilities.

Identify potential projects: The goal of the plan is to identify projects that can reduce damages from future hazards (including risk assessment and hazard mitigation strategy) and opens the door for implementation of priority mitigation measures.

Types of projects that may be included: Bridge, roadway, and culvert improvements; stream erosion measures, drainage improvements, elevation or acquisition of vulnerable structures, storm-proofing critical facilities, etc.



What is a Mitigation Grant?

Whenever there is a declared disaster, a portion (15%) of the money allocated is set aside for mitigation measures. A hazard mitigation grant is 75/25, FEMA pays 75% of costs and the lead municipality pays a 25% match (some, or all, of the match can be "in-kind" services).



Please review the STAPLEE Action Evaluation Table. Listed on it are all the mitigation projects that we have been able to identify. A letter explaining the columns is attached.


Part of the Plan requirements is that every partner has at least one Mitigation Project. This is covered by the public education projects. See attached **Partner Projects Table**.


